Fee Waiver: Refugee or Asylum Seeker (and their Partner)
5. Fee free training - Fee free Apprenticeships (until 30 June 2027)

NSW Fee Free initiative - identified full qualifications on the NSW Skills list (until 31 Dec 2026)

Co-contribution fee amount Given the benefits of training, including improved job opportunities and higher earnings, students enrolled in certificate III qualifications and skill sets, and non-concessional students in lower-level qualifications, are required to contribute to the cost of training through a co-contribution (student) fee. This fee can be paid by an employer, a family member, a friend, or another organisation, but it cannot be paid or waived by the SAS or any person or entity connected to the SAS

How and when we charge fees - fees are charged to the host employer generally in the month of enrolment and represent the amount payable as per the state legislation.

Additional fees are determined between the RTO and the host employer as per their commercial agreement.
